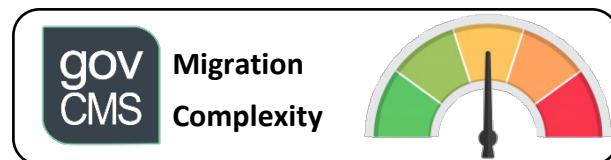


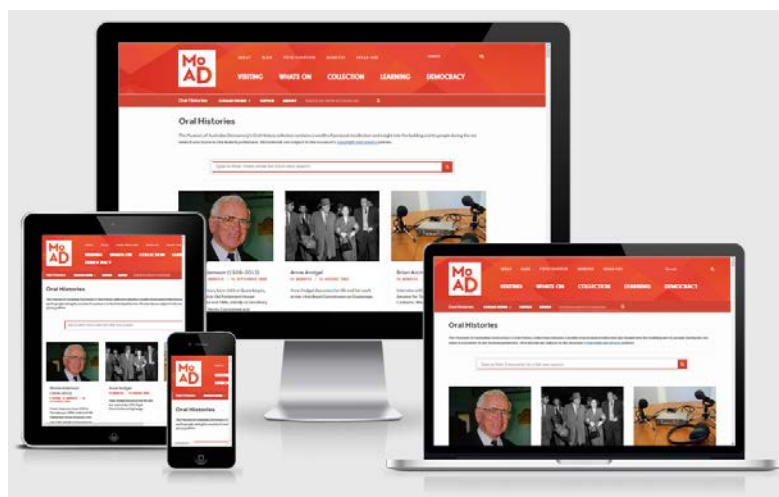

Findings



Branding / Design

The site leverages the main MoAD website branding. A number of page layouts are specific to the Oral Histories site.

The site includes a traditional menu, no breadcrumb and a number of separate search functions.



GovCMS Considerations

The site appears to be heavily database driven, and in the absence of any design documentation the analysis is limited to the content that is served publicly at the sites URL.

Observed functionality to be replicated includes:

- Metadata driven categories allowing speeches/transcripts to be sorted and classified.
- The database holds significant metadata for each speech, including the transcription, streamable and downloadable audio files, date, duration, interviewer etc. All of this information will need to be migrated to a GovCMS compatible database and the site functionality recreated.



Accessibility

The branding has a number of accessibility issues (WCAG 2.0 A and AA) which affect the majority of site pages. It is anticipated that some of these would be addressed in implementing the updated MoAD website branding being built for GovCMS.

Pages with WCAG 2.0 A issues are unusable for some people, pages with WCAG 2.0 AA issues make it difficult for some people to use the page.

The site does not contain any AGLS Metadata, which is mandatory for all Australian Government Agency Websites.



Responsive Design

The site either does not have a meta viewport specified, or it is configured incorrectly. Viewports are important to ensure that page content resizes appropriately for different devices, in particular mobile and tablet.

There is some text on the site that is small and may not be legible enough for particular users. Some of the links or buttons on the site may be too small for a user to easily tap on a touchscreen.



Broken Links

The site contains a small number of internal and external broken links for a site of this size and age. Internal links include links to pages, images or web artefacts within the current site, whilst external links can include web pages hosted on external sites, scripts / web resources from public repositories and multimedia files hosted on external sites.

Technical Recommendation

The Oral Histories site has a medium complexity rating, requiring considerable effort to recreate the current functionality (assessed on the end result only at this stage). The MoAD sites have over 58,000 links to their pages from other sites and ~3,200 domains that reference material on the site.

If this site is no longer actively maintained and updated, it is a perfect candidate for archiving to a static site and serving the content through the newly agreed approach to handling the museums static websites. There is no anticipated loss of functionality if the site is archived and served statically in future.
